ATTENDANCE POLICY FOR ALL CREDIT CLASSES

Students are required to attend all sessions. **A maximum of one (1) absence will be allowed FOR EMERGENCIES ONLY**. Attempts will be made to contact parents when students are absent. Any student with more than one (1) excused absence will be dismissed from the Summer School program and will not receive the one-half credit. Unexcused absences are not allowed.

Each class session will begin promptly at the time stated. Tardies will be recorded. **Two tardies will count as one half-day absence**. Students arriving to class more than five minutes late will find the classroom door closed, be recorded as absent, and will be admitted to class only with a pass from the Summer School Office if the excuse is judged to be legitimate. To avoid this action, students are urged to **BE ON TIME!!!**

ENGLISH 9

English 9 is designed to explore various literary genres. The course includes a study of the short story, novel, mythology, epic tale, drama, non-fiction, and research skills. In addition, speaking and listening skills are emphasized. Writing units will also be incorporated in each area of study, with an emphasis on developing meaningful ways for students to respond to literature. Freshman English provides a foundation for all students to develop in the language arts and be successful in high school. All course curriculum has been developed in alignment with the Common Core Standards.

English 10 is designed to examine historical periods throughout American Literature and prepare tenth grade students for junior/senior level course work and college readiness. The class includes a study of the short story, novel, drama, poetry, non-fiction, and oral communication skills. Expository, research-based and narrative writing units as well as literary analysis will be incorporated in each area of study. American Studies and Composition requires critical thinking and employs student assessments that authenticate learning through a variety of student products.

- **Course Description:** The intent of this rigorous 3-week course is to remediate the concepts and skills relevant to the second semester of our district's Algebra 1 curriculum. Course learning objectives will include, but are not limited to, systems of equations and inequalities, analysis of data sets including one or two variables, quadratic functions and modeling, and real number systems. The instructor will be implementing a blended approach to instruction that combines a student-centered collaborative classroom environment with independent opportunities for online learning.
- **Target Population:** Students who successfully completed first semester of Algebra 1, but attempted and failed second semester of Algebra 1, should enroll in this course. Successful completion of this remediation course will earn the student 0.5 math credits.

- Course Description: The intent of this 3-week course is to build students' algebraic habits of mind and key mathematical ways of thinking. Students will explore algebraic logic puzzles that connect to Algebra 1 course topics and learn broadly-applicable tools and strategies to help them make sense of what they will be learning in Algebra 1. Students will discuss and refine their ideas as they work through mental mathematics activities, written puzzles, spoken dialogues, and hands-on explorations that engage them in cultivating mathematical knowledge, intuition, and skills.
- Target Population: Students who meet one of the three criteria listed below. Successful completion of this remediation course will earn the student 0.5 math credits.
 - Those who successfully completed Pre-Algebra and intend on enrolling in Algebra 1 in the fall.
 - Those who failed Algebra 1 first semester, successfully remediated first semester Algebra 1 credit during the spring semester, and intend on working to earn second semester Algebra 1 credit in the fall.
 - Those who failed both semesters of Algebra 1 this year and intend on retaking Algebra 1 in the fall.
