As a result, the Wausau School District will move forward with addressing long-term facility needs across three main categories:


- 1) Safety & Security

Wausau School District Receives More Than \$117,000 for Mental Health Resources for Students



On Monday, April 11, the Wausau School District was given a check for \$117,466.00 to help provide additional mental health supports for students. Superintendent Dr. Keith Hilts and Wausau Mayor Katie Rosenberg accepted the check from Governor Tony Evers during his visit to the Greater Wausau Area.

A total of \$15 million is available to districts across the state as part of the Governor's 'Get Kids Ahead' initiative. The goal of the initiative is to ensure students are successful both inside and outside of the classroom by making sure they have all of the mental health support they need.

The Wausau School District continues to focus on student mental health. For example, the District recently added dozens of additional Pupil Services staff, thanks to the passing of a referendum in 2021. Whether it's staff or additional funding for mental health, all of those tools truly help us advance student learning, achievement, and success.

Cale Bushman Hired as District's Next Director of Pupil Services





Proceeds from the sales of the shoes collected in shoe drive fundraisers are used to feed, clothe, and house their families.
