NEEW! District and School Report Cards Released

Our mission at the Wausau School District is to advance student learning, achievement, and and the release of the district of the dist

success. As a learning community, we are continually looking to improve. The district and school report cards, released by the Department of Public Instruction (DPI), are one resource we use to reflect on our strengths and areas for improvement.

They are intended to help schools and districts use performance data to celebrate successes and improve their efforts to prepare students for their futures. These public report cards can be found <u>here.</u>

The current school report card is primarily based on last year's performance during the 2020-21 school year. <u>Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, DPI encourages caution when interpreting</u> <u>scores and ratings on the 2020-21 report cards.</u>

At the foundation of the report cards are four priority areas. Schools and districts receive a score for each priority area:

- Achievement proficiency in English language arts (ELA) and mathematics on the annual state assessments
- Growth year-to-year progress in ELA and math achievement
- **Target Group Outcomes** outcomes for students with the lowest test scores: the Target Group.
- **On-Track to Graduation** reliable predictors of how successfully students are progressing toward completing their K-12 education.

The priority area scores are aggregated into an overall accountability score, from 0 to 100. This score is displayed on the front page of the school or district report cards. It is important to note that the 0 to 100 accountability score is not a "percent correct" measurement. Based on its score, a school or district receives one of five rating categories, from *Fails to Meet Expectations* to *Significantly Exceeds Expectations*, as well as corresponding one to five stars.

The Wausau School District's Overall Score is 68; Meeting Expectations. The Wausau School District is analyzing this data now; finding areas where we can improve, while at the same time, celebrating the fact that our students are supported; poised to graduate ready for college, career, and life.

John Muir Middle School Associate Principal Named Wisconsin Associate Principal of the Year!



Matthew Raduechel, John Muir Middle School Associate Principal, has been named the 2022 Wisconsin Associate Principal of the Year by the Association of Wisconsin School Administrators (AWSA).

During Raduechel's 4.5 years at the school, he has focused on student safety and wellbeing. He helped create and build the school's BRIDGE behavioral intervention program, which helps students in moments when emotions and behaviors can disrupt their learning. He has also become a certified restorative practice trainer through the International Institute of Restorative Practices.

Raduechel, along with the John Muir staff, has also worked to ensure students receive an equitable and diverse educational experience.

He will be formally recognized at the Associate Principals Conference in January in Green Bay. He will also receive \$1,000 for use on a project of his choice at John Muir. Raduechel will also get to represent the state of Wisconsin at the National Principals Conference.

Thomas Jefferson: A U.S. News Best Elementary School

Thomas Jefferson Elementary School has been placed among the top 30% of elementary

schools in the state of Wisconsin by U.S. News & World Report. That makes it a U.S. News Best Elementary School.


